



Total Joint Antibiotic Protocol

For future dental work and surgery, it may be necessary to protect your new joint with antibiotics. **Keep this paper for future reference to show your dentist and other doctors.**

Dr Salin requires the use of antibiotic prophylaxis for the first 2 years after your joint replacement. After 2 years, he does not require, but recommends you continue the use of antibiotic prophylaxis for the life of the implant.

Dental Procedures

- First option: Amoxicillin 2 Gms by mouth 1 hour prior to procedure.
 - a. If allergic to Amoxicillin, substitute Keflex 2 Gms by mouth 1 hour prior to procedure.
 - b. If allergic to Keflex, substitute Clindamycin 600 mg by mouth 1 hour prior to procedure.
